Some work has taken place in preparation for adding Council Minutes for download from the website. Hopefully the minutes of the February meeting will be available this way.



#### 5(j) (ii) DEMONSTRATORS' REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT - Mrs Pat Murphy

No report from the National Demonstrators Committee as their meeting is to be held next Tuesday, 23th February.

Michael Bowyer – Chairman of the National Demonstrators Committee – asked for the following email to be distributed to all Area Demonstrators on the Cheshire List as follows:-

The National Demonstrators Test will be held on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> October 2016 with a day of advice and guidance to be held at Osborne House on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> February next for Area Demonstrators keen to take the next step to being a National Demonstrator.

Flower Allowances – the recommended flower allowance for a demonstration by an Area Demonstrator to an average sized club for 2016 is **£100**. This is only a recommendation and he reminded Demonstrators that they must not use their fee or travel allowance to subsidise the flower allowance.

Mileage – With the current price of fuel the mileage rate is 45p per mile and will remain so until fuel increases to  $\pm 1.31$  a litre. If the price drops even more the mileage rate never goes below 45p a mile.

An explanation was given to Council members of the new Media Permission Form to be used by Clubs at a Demonstration.
